Goin' with the retro flow

Lately I spend my days pawing through newspapers of the 1930s, '40s and '50s. Did you know they used to have "society" columns? Parties, showers, family trips, cooking classes, club meetings — it all made the paper. You even got details on people's illnesses and hospitalizations.

If you're trying to learn what it was really like back then, that's gold. The essence of people's lives is not in the headlines, but in the little stories that show us where their hearts were.

Did you know the *Star-Telegram* previewed sermon topics every Saturday? It did. And revivals, VBS and church camps got major billing. That got me thinking about those week-long Gospel Meetings ("revivals") of my youth. Often the visiting preacher would be featured in newspaper — in stories and ads — and built up so grandly I believed he'd surely been at least in the running for apostle.

Every night we'd have 45-minute sermons, invitations when we'd sing 50 verses of "Just As I Am." He would stop the song leader to plead, "Twenty have already come! Surely there are more! Don't go home tonight outside the kingdom — come while you still have time!" The aisles would stream with tearful people, repenting of their sins and feeling the embrace and salvation of God.

There are things nobody misses about that era — polio and segregation come to mind — but some of that raw emotion needs another revival. I know this pandemic has given us an opportunity, alone and in small groups, to dive deeper in our faith. But when all of us can finally gather again and focus on the grandeur of God, the sacrifice of Jesus, the reality and power of the Holy Spirit who lives in us — I expect some real tears, on my face and many others.

It won't be the songs, or the eloquence of the prayers or even what the preacher says. It'll be what *we* bring, what's in our hearts. That's not retro — it's timeless.
