Deacon Digest "The Rich Young Ruler" - by Bradley Bryant

Before you start to read this one, turn your Bible to Mark 10:17-31 and then ponder this poorly written parable as a possible outcome of an interaction with the Messiah.

Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "One thing you lack: go and sell all you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." At these words, he was saddened, and he went away grieving, for he was one who owned much property.

The words of Jesus followed him home. They sat with him at supper. They met him in his fields and storehouses. For several days, he did nothing but think. Then, at last, he sold one piece of land. With the money, he bought bread for the hungry in his town. It did not fix him. But it did something. So he sold another piece and gave a drink to the thirsty. Then he opened a room in his house to strangers passing through. Then he paid for oil and bandages for the sick. Then he sent food, blankets, and help to men sitting in prison. Widows began to find steady bread. Fatherless children found a place to sleep. Families buried in debt found themselves standing up straight again.

At first, it felt like a loss. Then it felt like relief. Then, somewhere along the way, it began to feel like joy. What he had once called his own started looking different to him. The silver was not his. The fields were not his. The grain was not his. It had all belonged to God before it ever passed through his hands. He had only been clutching what was never really his. So he became freer and freer with it.

His house grew plainer. His robes grew simpler. His name carried less weight in the marketplace than it once had. But his laughter came easier, his sleep grew sweeter, and his hands stayed open. The more he gave away, the less sorrow he had left to hold on to. And by the end of his life, the man who once walked away grieving had spent nearly everything he had. Except for his joy. He went running into the kingdom of God.
